## What is Northern Ontario GPS Treasure Hunting?

The GPS treasure hunt combines the navigation of a hand held Global Positioning System receiver and the excitement of a treasure hunt, all within our great outdoors. A cache is a hiding place for the treasure and the GPS unit is used to find on the ground where the cache (treasure) is located. "GEO caching" in a general form - has been around for a few years. There are 3 types of caches

1. Virtual (where you look for some key word in a sign)
2. Commercial (where you find the key word in a merchant's place of business)
3. Live Cache (where you find the traditional box or bucket with prizes, etc.)

## The "GEO Cache" protocol:

In each "live cache" remember to replace your practical, special prize with one of equal value and significance. Remember to record the needed **CODE** word as it makes you eligible for the yearly prizes, drawn on the last day of December of the year identified on the website.

Check the website, the **Prizes and Discounts and Reporting Page** on how to enter. We have a computer in the Games Room you can use to access the internet if you wish. There is a small charge for using the machine.
